Businesses in La Crosse and throughout the Coulee Region understand the concept that a "rising tide lifts all ships" and band together in a range of organizations dedicated to driving community-wide growth and providing support for businesses of all sizes and at all stages.

While informal networks and mentorship are useful for individual businesspeople, formal organizations also coordinate everything from joint marketing and community events to business training and networking opportunities.

The La Crosse Area Chamber of Commerce has been a voice of the business community since 1868, advocating for and promoting business growth and offering networking and educational opportunities. La Crosse's business districts stretch from French Island to the south side and north on Highway 16, including Decker Design Inc., La Crosse Fireplace, Midwest TV & Appliance, O'Brien Physical Therapy and Schumacher-Kish Funeral and Cremation Services.

The city's core retail district, home to **Trust Point, Larson's General, D.M. Harris Law** and **Hanson & Associates,** is represented by Downtown Mainstreet Inc., dedicated to promoting the downtown, beautification projects and advocacy that supports downtown businesses. The North La Crosse Business Association is also focused on promoting its historic retail district, home to businesses such as **The Motherhood Collective.** Through mentoring, **Sister Circle** brings together entrepreneurs to help both the business owners and community thrive.

Several organizations based in La Crosse offer business support efforts that extend beyond the city limits, including Wisconsin Women's Business Initiative Corporation (WWBIC), with a regional office located in La Crosse to provide business training, support for new business owners, networking opportunities and microloans. The Small Business Development Center at University of Wisconsin-La Crosse can provide access to SBA loans, assistance in creating business plans and more. Couleecap's business support arm offers feasibility and business planning, marketing advice and a retail incubator to La Crosse, Vernon, Crawford and Monroe counties. SCORE's experienced businesspeople are mentors for those seeking support to develop or grow their businesses.

La Crosse is also home to the Coulee Region Business Center business incubator, which offers light industrial and office spaces as well as a commercial kitchen.

Of course, we can't always be working. La Crosse is full of festivals and activities year-round: Rotary Lights, Oktoberfest, Irishfest, La Crosse Logger baseball and La Crosse Steam softball teams, Juneteenth, Moon Tunes, Great River Folk Festival, the La Crosse Community Theatre, the La Crosse Symphony Orchestra and a host of other arts, organizations and events keep the social calendar full and the community hopping.

Onalaska

With a diverse business mix spread across the original downtown, neighborhood centers, the Highway 16 and I-90 corridors and other locations throughout the community, the Onalaska Business Association strives to bring together a wide range of members to create community connections and foster networking among businesses.

The organization hosts monthly luncheons and "After 5" events designed to help business owners and leaders from throughout the community learn more about other businesses so they can support the community's success.

Onalaska's business community includes women supporting women (see our page 9 lead story for examples), with a complete complement of retail, financial services, professional services and more. You'll find wellness-focused businesses such as **Om Yoga**, personal services like **Nail Dept. and More**, business services like **CPC Printing & Promotions** and **The Monogram Company** and building specialists including **Elevations by Wisconsin Building Supply** and **Solid Surface Specialists**, alongside restaurants, professional services, pet services, health care, retail boutiques and more.

Activities throughout the year connect community members and draw visitors in to enjoy the bike trails, waterfront amenities and more.

Great River Sound, hosted in Dash-Park, directly across from the Great River Landing in downtown Onalaska, is a free weekly summer music concert series featuring everything from folk and calypso to rock and blues. Art lovers can join in the treasure hunt for unique paintings hidden around town each year as part of Pop Up Onalaska, hosted by the Onalaska Art Keepers.

Other summer events include Celebrate Onalaska in late June, complete with fireworks for the community, and Onalaska Community Days later in the summer, highlighted by music and a wide range of family activities hosted by area businesses and organizations.

The city's heritage as logging river town takes center stage when Onalaska hosts Three Rivers Roleo, a log-rolling competition that draws in national champions in the sport.

And nearly every weekend will find the parking lot full at the Omnicenter, which hosts everything from hockey tournaments and craft shows to family reunions and even midweek bingo,

bridge and mah jongg games.

For outdoors enthusiasts, Onalaska is the perfect jumpingoff point to ride either the Great River Trail or La Crosse River Trail, providing access to miles and miles of rail-to-trail cycling (or snowmobiling in the winter), and its location on Lake Onalaska makes it an angler's paradise yearround.





La Crescent | Winona

On the west side of the Mississippi River, La Crescent and Winona and their smaller neighboring communities are home to dedicated business owners and leaders.

Explore La Crescent is that community's lead organization, combining business support with tourism promotion, as well as hosting a unique coworking space available to entrepreneurs and others looking for a way to get a toehold in business.

Surrounded by orchards, La Crescent's flagship celebration, fittingly, is Applefest USA each September, featuring a flea market, car show, rides and the Sunday King Apple parade.

Summer staples include a farmers market and the Apple Jacks Base Ball Club, offering a glimpse into the past as they play by rules from 1860.

To the north, in Winona, the Winona Area Chamber of Commerce also offers opportunity for career development alongside its business advocacy through a Young Professionals organization and "Network Nites" designed to connect the business community's members in a relaxed setting.

Like La Crosse, Winona is home to multiple colleges and universities that provide opportunities for professional development, networking and business planning support to those looking to build new businesses, like **SturdyBird Mental Health**. The community also is home to an organization dedicated specifically to helping women find the support they need: Winona Women in Business.

Winona businesswomen can find plenty of ways to share time with those they meet during networking meetings at the many events hosted in the city. Winona is a dream for the fine arts enthusiast, with a selection of annual events sure to delight, starting with the Frozen River Film Festival, highlighting the best of independent filmmaking and documentaries from around the world. Settle in for everything from a deep dive into the world of air guitar competitions to stories from attorneys on the front lines of the migrant crisis or enjoy a quick conversation with a whale.

If live theater is more your thing, a summer's worth of fantastic performances awaits during the Great River Shakespeare Festival, with both traditional and remastered takes on the work of the bard. Complete your appreciation for classic performances at the Minnesota Beethoven Festival. But don't worry, not everything is from the 16th or 18th century. Winona is also home to a Dixieland Jazz Festival, Mid West Music Fest and Boats and Bluegrass.

And the city's history as a river town takes center stage each summer during Steamboat Days.



Holmen | Galesville | Trempealeau

North of La Crosse and Onalaska, several communities maintain a small-town atmosphere full of locally owned businesses both new and well-established, even as their populations grow.

An expanding selection of retail businesses in Holmen are complemented by restaurants, professional services and more, all brought together for networking and community vitality by the Holmen Business Association, which hosts regular meetings and sponsors events to foster community pride. Businesses based in this region, such as **Holmen Pumping Service** and **WNB Financial**, are located to serve the growing residential communities in both in La Crosse and Trempealeau counties.

Holmen's August Kornfest offers a three-day late-summer festival centered around fresh corn-on-the-cob (of course!), a parade, live music and more. Other opportunities for free community entertainment occur all summer with Sunday night concerts in Halfway Creek Park, occasional movies under the stars and a National Night Out celebration, plus a fall festival, and in early December, Holidays in the Park includes a lighting ceremony, tree decorating contest and Jingle Fest parade.

Meanwhile, the orchards surrounding Galesville are an obvious connection to the fall Apple Affair, featuring an apple pie that feeds hundreds of hungry people each year. A vibrant downtown, weekly farmers markets and monthly Downtown Walk About events are even more reasons to pop in and out of a variety of boutiques, bakeries, cafes and coffee shops.

Galesville's thriving downtown business district—with a central square ringed by businesses largely owned and managed by women—hosts its own events through the Downtown Galesville Business Alliance, as well as joining in the promotion and networking offered through the Galesville Chamber of Commerce.

In Trempealeau, home to **Small Town Beauty by Asia**, the community's businesses band together to promote cooperation and tourism focused on the area's attractions through the Trempealeau Chamber of Commerce & Tourism. As well as being home to a state park, state bicycle trail and growing residential areas, Trempealeau's business community has welcomed new members in recent years. The mid-July Catfish Days festival is fitting for a town tucked between the bluffs and the rivers. You can even bike from Holmen or Onalaska to Trempealeau (and beyond to Perrot State Park and the Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge) by hopping on the Halfway Creek Trail in Holmen and linking to the Great River Trail.



West Salem | Bangor | Sparta

Following the transportation trails east of La Crosse—river, highways, interstate or bike trail, take your pick—you'll find several small communities building their business communities and thriving in a new era.

As you enter West Salem on U.S. Highway 16, just past Veterans Park with its campground and fishing pond, you'll encounter the La Crosse Interstate Fairgrounds and La Crosse Speedway, staples of summer fun for the entire region.

The West Salem Business Association hosts networking lunches, offers support to member businesses and engages the entire community in its National Night Out celebration each summer. A thriving industrial park with interstate access is complemented by a downtown with restaurants and retail and the Highway 16 corridor, where **Beyer Cabinets** can be found, along with everything from auto dealerships to bakeries and BBQ.


West Salem is home to an annual June Dairy Days celebration, and in the fall Veterans Park plays host to the Hmong New Year Celebration. And summer and winter both bring enthusiasts to Lake Neshonec for skiing—water or cross-country!

Next along that route, Bangor hosts an annual Fun Daze each August, with bingo, baseball, duck races and fun runs (of both the footrace and ATV kind), as well as a Sunday parade and car show. Business owners and entrepreneurs are busy remodeling and reviving the historic downtown with unique shops and dining worth the detour from the interstate. Sparta celebrates all things bicycle—and space—honoring its unique location at the head of the Sparta-Elroy Bike Trail and its history as the home of one of America's first astronauts. Businesses in the community find support from the Sparta Area Chamber of Commerce, which combines networking for leaders with support for the tourism industry as host of a range of community events.

Its location in the heart of Wisconsin's farming country lends itself to its annual early summer Butter Fest, which, true to its name, includes a butter giveaway and a cow-milking contest. With the La Crosse River winding through town, Sparta is also a natural to host Pedal Paddle Fish Days, a full weekend of trout fishing, cycling and kayaking, plus a cardboard boat race.

The holidays take on a European charm with weekends highlighted by Kriskindlmarkt, offering local vendors, authentic German foods and a warm atmosphere to welcome Christmas.



Smaller towns throughout the Coulee Region recognize the importance of collaboration to promote the unique characteristics of each location, and Vernon County's communities are no exception. Coon Valley, Westby and Viroqua each are supported by local organizations focused on sharing their stories, bringing community members together and attracting visitors to experience the Driftless Region.

The Coon Valley Business Association hosts events large and small throughout the year, making good use of the renowned trout stream that runs through town by hosting both a Coon Creek Trout Fest and the Coon Creek Canoe Race as summer entertainment. The holidays bring an annual tree lighting ceremony, a craft show and Christmas in the Village, with horse-drawn carriage rides, ornament making, games and a coloring contest for the kids.

Just down the road, the Westby Area Chamber of Commerce and other community organizations showcase the hardiness and daring of the early Norwegian immigrants in the area and the daring athletes who follow in their footsteps—with the Snowflake Ski Club's annual Ski Jump Tournament, launching skiers into the air for more than 100 years. If you'd rather

The Viroqua Chamber Main Street organization is a gathering point for information about all types of activities taking place throughout the region, with a packed newsletter and calendar of events that invite all to the county seat for fun, networking and a range of businesses. Depending on when you visit Viroqua, you might encounter everything from a holiday Twinklefest to the Driftless Music Festival and more free live music throughout the summer during the Live in Viroqua series. You'll think you've stepped into a John Wayne movie with Wild West Days, featuring a horse pull, rodeo, stagecoach rides and re-enactments, held each August, and you can follow it up a month later with the old-fashioned delights of a county fair that traces its history to 1856.

The region is also home to many Amish artisans and farms offering handmade goods in local stores or from their farms. And hiking and fishing can be found throughout the county's parks and state natural areas, as well as historic sites.
